Jane Austen remains one of the most widely adapted authors. The wit and pluck of her heroines and the distinctiveness of her characters resonate even today. But what were her inspirations? What did she draw from her life that went into her novels?

Now every Austen reader has the opportunity to explore these questions for themselves at the exhibit "A Woman's Wit: Jane Austen's Life and Legacy," at the Morgan Library and Museum. See

actual manuscript pages, read the letters she wrote to family, see first and early editions, original illustrations and the art that influenced her. The exhibit also features still photographs and costumes from many of the film and television adaptations, including “Pride and Prejudice” starring Colin Firth and “Sense and Sensibility” with Kate Winslet and Emma Thompson.
